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Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge Honored as One of the Top Workplaces in America Ranked Third in the Nation for Non-Profit Organizations

MINNEAPOLIS — Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge was recently named one of the top workplaces in the country by Top Workplaces USA, coming in at third in the nation among non-profit organizations with 500 - 999 employees. The rankings are based solely on employee feedback, making them a strong indicator of employee satisfaction.

"It's an honor to be chosen for this award," says Tracee Anderson, director of prevention and community engagement at Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge. "This ranking is especially rewarding because it was based on feedback from the people who know us best — our employees. Knowing they feel valued and enjoy working with us shows that we have built a great company culture."

Many employees at Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge are graduates of the organization's long-term recovery program. Employees are passionate about the work they do and feel a strong sense of cohesion and family.

Taylor Hohmann, community engagement manager at Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge, says, "Working for the organization that helped give me a second chance at life, helped me to find my true identity, and has provided a safe space for me, adds a special dynamic. Giving back to an organization that has changed mine and so many lives is the very least I can do. It's an honor to work here. The work at Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge is important because it goes far beyond a person finding recovery and a fresh start in life. It's life and soul saving work."

Top Workplaces USA, the nation's most credible employer recognition program, celebrates nationally-recognized companies that make the world a better place to work. Rankings are determined based on quantitative employee feedback and statements and demographic information collected within the Workplace Survey, which measures alignment, coaching, connection, engagement and leadership. To qualify, companies must achieve a response rate to the Workplace Survey of 35 percent or higher. In 2021, Top Workplaces USA surveyed more than 1,100 organizations, including Progressive, Edward Jones, HubSpot and more.

More than 650 Minnesota Adult and Teen Challenge employees across 11 locations in Minnesota filled out the survey on workplace culture.
